Visual Institutional Consultation Package — Version 1

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Executive Summary

Victoria's renovation sector has evolved significantly over recent decades. At the same time, ageing housing stock, concealed structural deterioration, renovation complexity and progressive hidden-condition escalation are increasingly common realities throughout the residential renovation market.

This consultation package proposes consideration of a controlled Registered Residential Carpenter (RRC) pilot pathway designed to improve consumer protection, accountability clarity and practical renovation oversight within clearly defined safeguards.

The proposal is intended to strengthen accountability and better align the framework with modern renovation realities.

Case Study 01 — Progressive Hidden Subfloor Failure

A minor visible floor issue progressively escalated into major concealed structural failure once the subfloor environment was opened and investigated.



Case Study 02 — Hidden Historical Alterations

During renovation works, concealed walls, hidden structural changes and undocumented historical modifications were progressively discovered behind existing finishes.



Case Study 03 — Concealed Structural Deterioration

Once demolition commenced, concealed deterioration within framing systems became visible, significantly altering the project scope.



The Regulatory Gap

The evidence collected throughout this consultation package demonstrates recurring operational patterns including:

- concealed structural deterioration
- progressive project escalation
- hidden hazardous materials
- staged renovation evolution
- threshold mismatch
- continuity-of-repair necessity
- consumer misunderstanding
- ageing housing-stock realities

The recurring theme across these evidence categories is that renovation environments are dynamic, progressively revealed and frequently incapable of being fully understood upfront.

Identified Issue	Operational Reality
Hidden Conditions	Often impossible to fully identify before demolition
Threshold Escalation	Projects evolve progressively during works
Consumer Confusion	Homeowners misunderstand responsibility & permits
Continuity	Safe continuation becomes necessary once structures are opened
